



### An Easter message from our Chairman, Hussein Syed

March 2020, the first Covid-19 lockdown. Who would have thought that two years later, one of the variants would be so rampant as to make catching Covid almost normal albeit not as severe as in the pre-vaccine world? The impact has been enormous worldwide with hospitals bearing the brunt of the pandemic. Our volunteers are, understandably, still not allowed on the wards and it is still anybody's guess when they will be allowed despite the relaxing of restrictions outside of hospitals.

Our volunteers have been patient and loyal and there might be non-ward volunteering opportunities especially as the Trust is moving many outpatient clinics to the Vanguard site. We are fortunate in that we have another string to our bow in the provision of grants to the hospital for medical equipment and facilities for patients. Our £300,000 investment several years ago has generated enough funds for us to have withdrawn £172,000 over the years for the provision of grants. The value of the investment is still over £300,000 in our medium risk portfolio.

I must also thank our trustees for continuing their sterling efforts to keep FOYH going especially through rigorous governance during these difficult times. We are still on the lookout for one or two more trustees so do think about joining us.

#### **Volunteers update**

Sadly we must report that Mrs Margaret Clowes, a FOYH volunteer since 2009 has died. Margaret was one of the team delivering newspapers to patients on the wards and a loved and respected member of the team. Our thoughts go to her family.

York Hospital is in a difficult situation at the moment with staff sickness and a high number of vacancies.

However, the hospital remains open to volunteers who are helping as best they can, taking on non-professional duties such as helping patients with meals and beverages, assisting family liaison by telephone or electronic messages and answering the telephone to general enquiries. This work allows the medical and nursing staff time to concentrate on their duties knowing that others can help with support. If anyone is willing to assist please do let us know.

The help that hospital volunteers are providing has been recognised from the senior level of NHS staff downwards and the Board of Trustees of FOYH join in with their praise.

All the volunteer roles which have re-started have been through a lengthy risk assessment process aimed at keeping everyone as safe and healthy as possible. It is still necessary for masks to be worn in patient and public areas and we do try to convey an open and honest picture of how things are. Recent guidance regarding COVID testing suspends the twice weekly testing of asymptomatic volunteers apart from those who are classified as "High Risk of severe COVID-19 infection" and "all of those who work in clinical areas designated for High Risk of severe COVID-19 infection patients". The areas in York Hospital: Wards 31 & 33, Intensive Care Unit, Renal Dialysis Unit and Outpatients Services for Haematology, Oncology, Renal and Rheumatology."

We held a very enjoyable coffee morning for volunteers at the Hotel du Vin, York which was an opportunity to meet with fellow volunteers and some FOYH trustees in a lovely setting. We were fortunate to be joined by Lauren Rainer, Volunteer Manager for the Trust who was able to provide details of the current position in York and to pass on her thanks to our Volunteers.

Lauren said "Volunteering has changed from being wanted, to being needed."
