#### A Christmas message from our Chairman, Hussein Syed

At this time of year one wishes everyone tidings of comfort and joy. With the cost of living crisis among the many problems facing us at the moment, it seems difficult to convey these sentiments but we must retain our optimism and hope. This applies both generally and to FOYH.

You will be aware of the major change that will be taking place whereby all the volunteers at the Trust, including FOYH's will come under one management but each will retain its own identity. At our AGM this was discussed in great detail and formally approved. At the end of the day, it is the enhancement of patient care that matters above everything else from our perspective.

To this end, we are renewing our Memorandum of Understanding with the Trust which will be formally implemented at the end of March. In the meantime we will implement the details of the agreement and iron out any teething problems before March. Existing FOYH volunteers who wish to continue volunteering will need to ensure that their key details are updated and then a list of vacant positions will be advertised. New applicants to us will be vetted by us initially before any names are forwarded to the Trust for DBS checks, induction training, placements and management by the Trust. FOYH and the Trust will be working step in step in this whole process.

We continue to need more Trustees. Our Constitution allows a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 12 Trustees. One would expect that a natural source of Trustees would be the volunteers current and present, but unfortunately that is not the case. Our meetings take place every 2 months at the Hotel du Vin, on the Mount, who have been very generous to us over the years. They don't charge us for the use of the meeting room we use and give us a discounted rate on any food for the meeting. They also provide us with 3 generous prizes for the Annual Christmas raffle. We currently have 7 Trustees and ideally I think we should have about 9 or 10 especially with succession in mind. If anyone is interested please get in touch with me and I will explain what is involved.

It's left to me to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year on behalf of all the Trustees and please remember that optimism does not have a date stamp.

### More projects funded

#### **Care Packs for patients**



It's bad enough suddenly ending up in hospital but imagine if you have nothing to freshen up with?

We have funded £800 for care packs for patients who unexpectedly find themselves on a ward. The packs, sourced and packed by Rachel Martin, Trustee include a roll-on deodorant, flannel, toothbrush and toothpaste, shower gel, comb/brush and lip balm.

**Visual Field Equipment** – We funded £40K for Visual Field Equipment for the Eye Service at York Community Stadium. This includes a visual field analyser, focimeters and tonometers. Enhancing the service with the equipment will help to catch up on the backlog of patients resulting from the pandemic and reduce waiting times in the future. 

**Chairman's budget:** We have a Chairman's Budget of £500 each year to fund small items of equipment to improve the wellbeing of patients. Two items have recently been funded from this budget.

Voice Amplifier: A voice amplifier at a cost of £64 to help a patient to communicate. She had been borrowing one from Speech and Language Therapy but now has her own to take home when discharged making communication easier for her in the future.

Biozoon AIR with Flavour: £36 has funded this piece of equipment which allows Nil By Mouth patients to be able to taste a variety of flavours through "flavoured foam", with minimised risk of aspiration. Losing the ability to eat and drink has a huge implication on a person's quality of life due to the large role food plays in our everyday life. Research shows that AIR with Flavour® can be used to minimise distress by allowing people with swallowing difficulties to enjoy flavours of their choice whilst being free from the distress that swallowing problems and choking often present.

Ellen Curran, Speech and Language Therapist (Stroke and Voice) says that the equipment has already worked fantastically well with two patients.
